PARENT PORTAL is an internet ready program that allows parents, via their web browser, to access timely information about their child's progress in school. With a click of the mouse parents will have access to the daily bulletin, student grades, attendance, assignments, discipline, and even their child's teacher. Each parent will have a personal password to access your child's current records via the internet. The system is very secure. The information is confidential. If you qualified for free or reduced lunches last year you must reapply this year to continue receiving the assistance. If you did not qualify last year, please fill it out again as the guidelines change annually. The school lunch program helps the school and your family. The sooner these forms get back to the office, the sooner the assistance takes effect.

FROM THE DESK OF THE PRINCIPAL – MRS. BARBARA KUGLER

I hope everyone had a very enjoyable summer. I am very excited about the new school year. The teachers are getting their rooms organized and decorated. Just a reminder for the parents and students about the students' dress, shorts need to be below fingertips, no midriff, spaghetti strap, or tank top shirts.

The district will be implementing many programs to help the students improve academically. Our goal is to make sure every student is succeeding to his/her capabilities. No child should fail...but it is going to take support and cooperation from the parents and the teachers to make sure the children are succeeding.

A few reminders:

- Please call if your student is going to absent
- Please sign in at the Office when arriving at school
- Please send a note if there is a change in transportation for your student
- Please send a note if your student is taking medication

Our district is required to inform you of certain information that you, according to The No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 (Public Law 107-110), have the right to know.

Upon your request, our district is required to provide to you in a timely manner, the following information:

- Whether the teacher has met state qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether the teachers is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which state qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.
- What baccalaureate degree major the teacher has and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification.

In addition to the information that parents may request, districts must provide to each individual parent:

- information on the achievement level of the parent's child in each of the state academic assessments as required under this part; and
- timely notice that parent's child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who is not highly qualified.

NEW STUDENT & CURRENT ENROLLMENT

New students grades K – 12 that are **NOT REGISTERED** and students that need **SCHEDULE CHANGES** may come to school on Wednesday, August 10th or Thursday, August 11th. The office hours for registration and class changes are 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. If there is a student who needs to change their schedule or register on another date, they should call the school and make other arrangements, 738-4433. If you have a student to enroll for **Pre-School**, please contact Mrs. Kugler at the school, 738-4433 on Monday, August 8th or Tuesday, August 9th for enrollment information. To be eligible for Pre-School a child must be 4 years of age before August 1st and have had an early childhood screening.

We need the official 911 resident address in addition to your mailing address for every child in our school. We need this information for state residency requirements. We also need your place of employment and work phone number and/or cell phone number where you may be reached in case of an emergency. This is **VERY IMPORTANT** information for us to have in our files. Thank you for your cooperation.

BUS ROUTES AND DRIVERS

For the first day of school, all children should be ready to get on the bus by 7:00 a.m. if the driver has not indicated another time to the family. Please be patient the first few days of school because there may need to be some adjustments made to routes. If you ride the Vo-Tech Bus, it will leave the school at 7:35 a.m. If there is a particular question or special circumstance about the bus route, please call Mr. Butch Fore, Superintendent, at the school, 660-738-4433.

ATTENTION ALL KINDERGARTEN & 1ST GRADE STUDENTS - EYE EXAMINATIONS

A child's participation in the comprehensive eye exam or the eye screening program shall be excused upon receipt by the appropriate school administrator of a written request by the parent or legal guardian of the child.
